Headteachers Weekend Letter 09.05.21

Next week is mental health awareness week and the theme is connecting with nature. There's a lot of good research to support the role nature can play in protecting and supporting our mental health. Taking time to appreciate the beauty of the world around us helps lift our mood and exercise outside can reduce feelings of anger, tiredness and sadness. Since the beginning of this year, I have tried to walk every day outside (although the past week has involved a lot of getting wet!). In January I walked 200 miles, February 138 miles, March 164 miles, April 175 miles. I have currently walked 77 miles in May. This has obviously improved my physical health, but it is also helping my mental health as I take time out to listen to nature and feel the fresh air. Hopefully you manage to do this too.

The impact of Earth Day has been obvious to see with many of the children working for their Blue Peter badge and taking care of the environment. I would like to thank you all for supporting your children in this and I know many of you have set charters in your own home and been litter picking in the local area.

Hopefully this week our new barriers and cones will come for outside. I would like to thank Mr and Mrs Collinson who donated £175 to school from money raised from their Christmas light display. I felt that using this money to help in keeping the children safe was a super use of it. It has meant we have been able to order cones with chains and the local authority are donating some aluminium children signs for outside. The authority will also look at sending traffic control workers to talk to parents parked illegally and issue a fine if needed.
