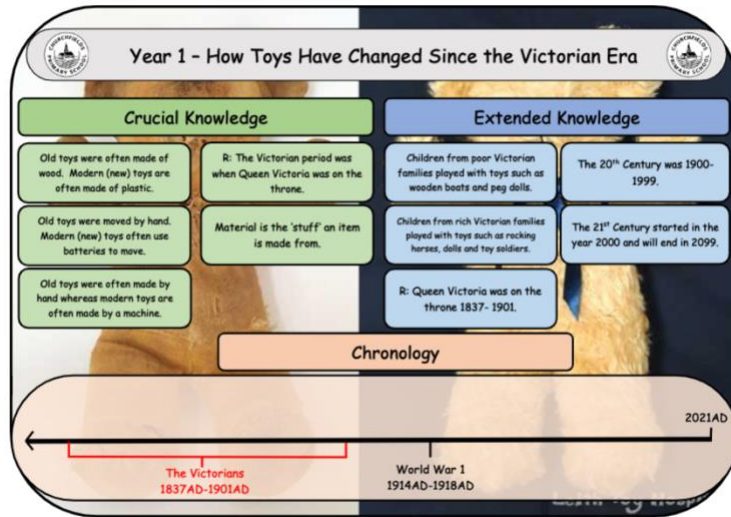

The information can be numbers, words, pictures, movies, or sounds tablet – a computer you can hold that has a touchscreen. iPads are a type of tablet. laptop – a fold out computer you can use on your lap or on a table. charge – plug in to make sure a device has power

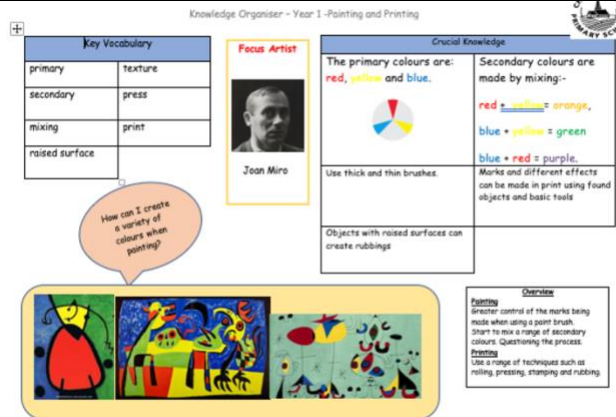
