## Internet safety

Our children are growing up in a world of ever-changing technology. While we feel that the use of technology is a largely positive aspect of modern life, we cannot ignore the risks that can be associated.

## Throughout school we aim to teach children:

- about the impact of cyber-bullying and what to do if they have been affected.
- to be vigilant when communicating online recognising that people may not always be who they say they are and to be sensible about what they share.
- to tell an adult they trust if something is upsetting them.
- to question the reliability of information given through a web-based source.
- to search responsibly for information while using internet browsers.

We understand that much of our pupil's use of the internet will occur at home, away from the school filters. A large part of our computing curriculum is around online safety and it forms part of our PSHE curriculum too. After talking to a lot of the children this week, particularly in the older year groups, they have spoken about asking for a phone for Christmas and the younger children talked about playing games etc. on mobile phones. By working together, we can ensure that the children keep themselves safe.
