Dear parents and carers,

Last week, Year 6 completed their SATS papers. I was so proud of each and every one of them because they all lived up to the school motto of being the best that they can be. I read on social media that the reading paper had 2200 words and the question paper had 1300. As a child reads on average 90 words a minute it would have taken them 24 minutes to just read the paper and a further 14 minutes to read the question paper. This would leave 22 minutes to actually answer the questions. One headteacher has written that children cried when opening the paper and were anxious. Our children showed superb resilience and not one child was upset they just knew that all we ask is they try their best. As I said to them on Friday it doesn't matter what results they get in July they have exceeded all my expectations with their fantastic attitude.

Road Safety

As the weather gets warmer, the children may be playing outside more and I know many children in year 5 and 6 are walking home. Currently, we do not have a crossing patrol on the crossing in front of school, so I will be asking staff to revisit road safety with all the children. Last week there were three separate occasions where members of the public contacted me saying they had nearly hit a child in Churchfields uniform as they crossed the road without looking. On one occasion, they crossed less than 10 metres away from the zebra crossing. Could I ask that you also reinforce this at home.

The Green Cross Code

- 1. Find a safe place to cross
- 2. Stop just before you get to the kerb
- 3. Look all around for traffic
- 4. If traffic is coming let it pass
- 5. When it is safe, go straight across the road do not run
- 6. Keep looking and listening as you cross.
